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INTERNET

CONNECTING

We have high speed Internet in the villa. It is only visible about 30 meters from the villa and no villa is near enough to be able to see the connection. You are safe.

WiFi Codes will be given to you on arrival.

Network 1 : Villa Henson covers the lounge, the terrace and pool area.

Network 2 : Manon2 covers the two bedrooms and part of the terrace.

You may also see our Chromecast dongles as a network (more later). Do not use them. There is also Home Theater. That's DishNetwork (Used with the Dish Anywhere app. If you have that you will be able to access your Home DN DVR.

CELL PHONES

WARNING

The villa is not capable of reaching the local St Barts cell network of Orange Caribe or Dauphin Telephone. Orange will not erect more access points. No idea why. This applies over many parts of the Island as well.

The only networks you will see at the villa are those on the Dutch side of St Maarten. If you use data through any of them the roaming charges are beyond reasonable. We were charged 50\$ for using our cell phone for 2 minutes and used messenger (bad idea) !!!! We've heard worse stories.

Switch on Airport mode here at the villa and just use Facetime, Messenger, What's App etc. or if you have to, turn off data roaming and Airport mode. If you have to, only use the St Maarten networks for SMS or cell calls.

MEDIA CENTER

Please do not access the back of the amplifier or the decoder.
It was working well when we left :)

If you use the Dish network DVR please turn the recording off when you leave - DVR/Options/Timers.

OVERVIEW

Our setup allows you to:

- Watch Dish Network Satellite
 - Dish has Netflix (use your account)
 - You can stream Netflix using Chromecast.
 - Use Chromecast to stream other media from your device
 - Listen to your music from Spotify, Deezer or iTunes etc. using the Sony amp's bluetooth
 - Or connect your device using the 3.5mm jack hanging left of the TV
 - Listen to local FM stations on Sony amp.
-
- All the TVs have Dish Network US Satellite.
 - All the TVs have a Chromecast dongle attached.

There is no sound from TV. The front sound is from a speaker behind the TV.

The Dish Network remote controls will operate the TVs as well. You only need the Sony AV remote in the lounge to switch from Dish to Media Box, Chromecast or FM radio.

To switch between the lounge and terrace speakers press the wall switch on left of the TV. The sound is still on in the lounge. We have neighbours!

The SPA will play your music via bluetooth. See Spa ff.

DISH NETWORK

For all TVs: The Dish (Dish Network) remote controls are programmed to operate the Sony TV (on/off - Volume) and Dish Satellite.

Turn on: Large red button turns TV, Amplifier and Dish on (Dish takes a little while to connect the first time so please be patient)

Turn off: Large red button Dish off / Small red TV button TV and Amp off

Sometimes you have to press 'SAT' or 'TV' first

CHROMECAST Operating

Chromecast allows you to “cast” (a.k.a. stream) to any of the 3 TVs, nearly any type of media on your device (Smartphone, iPad, iPhone, Laptop...) that displays the Chromecast icon shown on the right, which you should click to cast.



Your device does not have to be set up. However you need to use the CHROME browser. If you use Safari or another browser the icon will not appear. There are some apps for your devices available that help cast. But follow this guide and it should work well.

Casting will (should!) automatically turn on the your chosen TV to the correct channel.

FIRST Connect your device (Smartphone, iPad, iPhone, Laptop...) to either the network “Villa Henson” Lounge or terrace or the network “Manon 2”, in a bedroom.

If you see the icon on what you wish to see, you can cast.

If there is no, icon on say an image then, with Chrome open, click and drag it to the Chrome browser and then click the cast icon.

If the TV is off, casting will (should!) automatically turn on the TV to the correct channel

Next page connecting to the TVs

Clicking the CC icon on your device turns the selected TV on automatically. If you are watching Dish Network then...

BEDROOMS: Change the channel on the Sony TV to HDMI 2. Press the top left button on the Sony TV Remote - (Little arrow into a screen / scroll down to HDMI 2)

LOUNGE: On the Sony AV System Remote control, select MEDIA BOX

Open Chrome

Youtube: The cast icon is on the bottom right of the YT window or there is another on the top right of Chrome

A MP4 video clip or film: Drag the file onto an open Chrome window, then click the cast button.

For Netflix, follow their instructions.

If a CC shows up on the wi-fi network list with .b at the end it has a problem. Please ask Eric Magras for help.

BLUETOOTH PAIRING

Device: Open bluetooth preferences

Then on the Sony Amp: either Click Bluetooth button (over the big volume knob) or on the Sony AV remote control Click Bluetooth PAIRING (Right of FM button)

Device: Connect to 'STR-DH590' (the Sony Amp). Then on the Sony Amp click Bluetooth (Left of Media Box button)

FM Radio

You can turn off Dish and leave the TV on. Select FM (Tuner) on Sony AV remote. There are several station preset. Move to the Preset list on the screen.

HARDWIRE CONNECT YOUR DEVICE

Use the 3.5mm Jack (left of TV) Click SA-CD/CD on Sony AV remote

AIR CONDITIONING UNITS

TEMPERATURE: Set the A/Cs between 27°C and 22°C. It is NOT really necessary for a temperature lower than 22°C

Please keep the doors and windows closed when you use any of the A/Cs.

Always point the remote control at the unit for the commands to be registered.

The A/C units in the lounge and in the bedrooms should be turned off if you leave for a while. The rooms keeps cool and it only takes a minute or two to cool a room.

Each bedroom has an A/C unit and there is a remote control by each bed.

The A/C has been set with NO timer so it should remain on until you press the red on/off button. Please do not set a timer as you will probably have the A/C turn off in the middle of the night.

Slide down the cover to reveal other buttons for:

TEMPERATURE INDICATOR LIGHT. Press LIGHT to turn it off. It defaults to ON when the A/C is turned off then on later.

MODE: Set to COOL. Snowflake will show in window. If not then cycle through MODE until the snowflake appears.

Please turn « OFF » the A/C during the day when the bedrooms are NOT OCCUPIED. If the doors are closed and the curtains drawn the room stays cool.

THE A/C COOLS THE ROOM QUICKLY

WARNING: Leaving the A/C on all the time at 18° will cause condensation to run down the walls and introduce mushroom spores into the bedding (not pleasant and not healthy!)

Keep the bathroom door and window slightly but not fully open and the bedrooms stay cool for most of the day.

Help us save energy by using the A/C responsibly.

SPA

PLEASE READ THE INSTRUCTIONS - THEY ARE VERY IMPORTANT:

We want you to get the best out of the Spa. Read the manual if not sure about anything.

WARNING: The Waterproof seals in any watch, *your Rolex included*, are dilated by a short immersion in a heated Spa. Your very expensive waterproof watch will be damaged. Take it off before entering the spa. We cannot be responsible.

Take off the cover. The temperature will drop if left off for a while.

« **SPA COVER - IMPORTANT:** The cover IS BEST KEPT CLOSED but may be left off during the day or left half open unless the air temperature drops (unusual). Please always **replace the cover AT NIGHT** and use the clips. This conserves the heat and stops things falling into it.

As the air temperature can reach 37°C and more during the day, the Spa water will heat naturally and it has reached 39°/40° with the cover closed. If you find the water too hot, leave the cover OFF until the water cools.

In fact the temperature is set to 36° as the water heats naturally. Please do not try to over heat it as this may « turn » the water, which is not pleasant.

USE THE PLASTIC GLASSES.

DO NOT USE GLASSES IF YOU WANT TO DRINK IN OR AROUND THE SPA or POOL. Broken glass in the Spa (and the swimming pool!) is extremely dangerous and the Spa has to be drained and refilled. **You will be charged for this.**

WATER LEVEL: The water level in the Spa should be about halfway up the Filter cover. If it falls below either, ask Eric or Martha to get it topped up or just run in some water from the hose pipe behind the Spa.

NO GLASS GLASSES but ENJOY YOURSELVES.

Use Spa Bluetooth to play music

Open the small plastic door left and below the spa control panel. Switch on (lights up red)

Open your device. Look for TP-Link_Music.

Connect. Play something. Done. Please turn off when finished. cont/.

Spa Control Panel

On/Off puts the Spa on Standby and will shut down all pumps. Spa will shut down after a certain time.

This is not a fault.

Turn the knob near your seat to increase or decrease pump flow.

Pump 1 - Press once for low power pump - press again for higher power pump - and again to turn off.

Pump 2 - Press once turn on - and again to turn off.

Pump 3 - No Pump here!

Light - Turn on/off lights

Arrows Up/Down sets the temperature BUT PLEASE NOTE it will heat naturally with the cover closed to at least 35°C and more, depending on the weather. We leave it set to 24°C as it is not really needed.

If you see a Spanner icon, there is a fault. It may reset itself after 10 minutes or more. If not please report it to Eric or Martha.

SWIMMING POOL

THE POOL IS HEATED. IT IS SET TO A COMFORTABLE TEMPERATURE. PLEASE DO NOT CHANGE IT.

Do not use drinking glass near or in the pool or spa. Use the plastic ones (provided). If broken glass falls in the water it is extremely dangerous as it is invisible and sharp. The pool or spa then has to be drained of 30 cubic meters of water and cleaned. It will take two days to do and **you will be charged for this.**

1. **SWIMMING POOL ALARM: THIS IS A FRENCH LEGAL REQUIREMENT**

HOWEVER YOUR EYES ARE STILL THE BEST ALARM !!!

***We decline all responsibility in case of an accident. It is your responsibility to see that the alarm is correctly used and functions. Report any faults immediately.**

The alarm functions will be explained to you when you arrive.

The infrared beams protect the perimeter and the alarm will sound if the beams are broken.

If a chair obstructs the beam the alarm will not work.

CLEANING: The pool and spa are cleaned twice a week.

Pool Lights Show.

Switch is in the kitchen "Pool". There are 16 different light programs.

To change program, turn off the pool light and turn on within 2 seconds to move to the next program. It will remember the last program if left off for more than 20 seconds. Switch is in the kitchen "Pool". There are 16 different light programs.

White. Red. Green. Blue. Green-Blue. Red-Green. Blue-

Red. Evening Sea. Evening River. Riviera. White.

Rainbow.

VILLA SECURITY

Always lock the villa when you go out.

St Barts is a safe island but locking up is better than leaving the doors open!! Do lock the villa when you leave and do lock your cars when parking around the island.

IT IS NOT A GOOD IDEA TO TAKE THE KEYS TO THE BEACH.
HIDE THEM AFTER LOCKING UP OR LEAVE THEM IN YOUR CAR
OUT OF SIGHT.

LOST SAFE KEYS WILL BE CHARGED AT 200 \$

Each Bedroom key set has its SAFE key and a lounge key.

There is a third safe in the lounge. You set your own code. We have a key should you forget your code!!!

NOTE: To lock the lounge door, close the main door firmly and then push the little lever down. Then turn the key which will then lock the door. Lock the other doors first from the inside too.

NOTE: To lock the two bedroom doors, after closing the door, firmly lift the door handle upwards. The key will then turn fully clockwise and the door will lock.

Ici et La has a spare lounge key, Martha and Eric Magras both have complete sets.

TELEPHONES (Using)

There are 3 fixed telephones, one in each bedroom and one in the lounge and only local calls can be made from them. Place them back in their cradles to keep charged.

For international calls please use Skype, Messenger, Facetime etc.

There is an ANSWERPHONE. Dial 3103 and follow the instructions (*sorry but in French only!*) OR press the PLAY button on the lounge phone's base.

They can be switched around.

TERRACE FAN

Turn on the terrace fan using the remote control by the sink.

Set the speed with + or -

SUN BLIND

Open or close the terrace sun blind using the remote control by the sink.

WEBER BBQ

The gas BBQ must NOT BE USED UNDER THE CANOPY OR THE SUN BLIND. Please wheel it out onto the terrace or use it at the back near the utility room.

Also please be careful when parking it against the painted walls!

Make sure the gas is on. Rotate the top knob on the gas bottle to O = Open F= Closed. On the valve attached to the top of the gas bottle, **press the little red button** - where it joins the tube. It's under the valve.

The BBQ may not light if it is windy. Keep the lid closed, turn on the left burner and push the ignite switch. You should then hear the gas light. Light the others in the same way.

*NOTE: An empty bottle can be changed for a full one (look behind the villa). Turn the knob on the bottle clockwise to F incase a little gas is left. (spanners under BBQ). **Gas connections turn anti-clockwise or in the reverse direction to other connections!***

The bottle will be light if empty. (gas is in liquid form in the bottle).

PLEASE USE THE WIRE BRUSH TO CLEAN OFF SOME OF THE RESIDUE ON THE GRILLS WHILE THE BBQ IS STILL HOT.

COOKING WITH THE BBQ

Preheat the grill, lid closed, burners on high. 260/290°C (500/550°F) 5 mins and adjust the burners to the required heat for cooking. Then wire brush off any food particles, grease etc.

There are two ways to cook on our BBQ:

Direct heat (Lid open) for food that cooks quickly like burgers, steaks, chops, boneless chicken, fish, shellfish and sliced vegetables.

Indirect heat (Lid closed) for larger, tougher foods like roasts, whole chickens and ribs. Place large food on a rack inside a drip pan. Use drippings for gravy or sauce.

There is a **plancha tray** (no metal tools or forks please) which is great for small cut vegetables or shrimps and the like (they tend to fall through the grill!).

UTILITY ROOM

There is a utility room behind the villa. You are welcome to use the machines but **please ask Martha first.** Also, please do not use the machines when Martha comes to do the housework.

Many returning clients like to leave sun-beds, sun creams etc. for their next visit. LEAVE THOSE ITEMS IN THE **PUMP ROOM** UNDER THE TERRACE. WITH YOUR NAME ON AND PACKED/WRAPPED IF POSSIBLE and if you do not want them used by others. Wine will spoil if left in the pump room so either drink it or leave it for the next guest! Any spirits left in the lounge by clients are yours to drink. It seems that that is a custom!

The housekeeper is there to keep the villa clean and she will spend 2 hours at the villa each day except Sundays and bank holidays.

If the times are not convenient ask Martha to come at a different time but please understand that she has other employment obligations and cannot always change to a time of your choosing.

WATER

Water on the Island is scarce as there are no natural water sources! We either use the water produced by the desalination plant (TOWN WATER), which is very expensive or rainwater that is collected and stored in two tanks under the house (90 cubic meters in total when full)

The water is usually from the tanks so DO NOT drink the tap water. Buy bottled water.

The water in the fridge dispenser should be filled with bottled water. There is a small ice maker or use the little ice trays.

You can purchase ice in most supermarkets on the island. Try not to use water unnecessarily.

ELECTRICITY

The voltage is 220v and **60hz (not 50hz)*** There are two small 220v to 110v transformers in one of the blue plastic baskets in the cupboard plus some USA to French plug adaptors.

MAIN CIRCUIT BREAKER: In TOP fuse box under wall carpet in lounge near the toilet.

KITCHEN/LOUNGE CIRCUIT BREAKERS: In BOTTOM of the same fuse box.

BEDROOM CIRCUIT BREAKERS: In fuse box behind the TV in bedroom SABA.

SPA CIRCUIT BREAKER: In the utility room.

POOL CIRCUIT BREAKER: In the pool pump room under the terrace.

If a fuse trips, flick up the little lever on the fuse, if it trips again call Eric Magras.

Chargers, spare batteries and US/French plug adaptors and voltage changers (110v to 220v) are in the tall lounge cupboard

CHECK IN AND CHECK OUT

CHECKOUT TIME IS **NOON** AT THE LATEST but 11AM is better.

Please respect the check-out time. New guests will be arriving later that day and Martha has to prepare the villa for them.

YOU SHOULD CHECK IN AT THE AIRPORT ABOUT 90 MINUTES BEFORE DEPARTURE.

GATES ARE CLOSED 45 MINUTES BEFORE DEPARTURE.

If your flight from St Barts is in the afternoon think about having a goodbye lunch in one of the restaurants. The choice of food available in the airport in St Martin is very poor.

The St Barts Airport restaurant is good but busy.

The little restaurant "Le Jardin" opposite the terminal is great.

RE-BOOKING FOR NEXT YEAR

We have many returning guests, and several guests who will want your week/ s so....

If you wish to rebook the same week (same day to same day not same date to same date) for next year please do so within **one month** of leaving.

After that time we cannot guarantee you the same week/s.

We do get booked ahead fast as the villa is very popular as I am sure you understand!

HURRICANES

There is a small hurricane kit in the tall lounge cupboard. Just in case.

Introduction.

The Hurricane season is generally from August to October. There have been hurricanes even in January but that is a very rare event.

If you happen to be caught on St Barts with a hurricane please read this section entirely. YOU WILL BE VERY SAFE IF YOU FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTIONS. NO NEED TO PANIC!

After the 2017 hurricane - class 5 (it should be a 6 really), we will not allow any client to stay in the villa. We will not be responsible for any client who will not move to a designated safe place. The villa must be closed. There will be no Internet, no TV, no A/C, as the Mains electricity will be turned off. It was left on for Hurricane Irma and this ruined the Spa and other electrical equipment.

If you came through either "Ici et La" or "Marla" you must call them.

We can't move you to other accommodation or give you a refund (act of God !). There are special shelters in designated buildings. Make your enquiries well before the Red Alert.

You should have plenty of warning and time to find shelter. Listen to the FM on the amp or Internet for instructions.

The Warnings and four main levels of Alerts:

Yellow alert – The hurricane is expected soon – You can still leave the island.

Orange alert – The hurricane is imminent - You can no longer leave the island. The shops and the administrative buildings are now closed. You must go to the public shelter chosen.

Red alert - You should now be inside the designated shelter. Listen to Radio St Barth for instructions.

Violet alert – The hurricane is here, (if you haven't noticed!) **You are forbidden to go outside.** The emergency services will not respond.

During the period Violet you are must stay inside.

During the Violet alert – It can happen (and it did with Earl, Gonzalo and Irma) that the eye of the hurricane passes over St Barts. You may think that the storm has abated because the wind has dropped. This calm period can last several minutes or even longer but as the eye passes the winds will pick up from the opposite direction and fast. Wherever you are do not go out during this time.

Things like fridges or metal roof plates can be flying around. They are mortal. The end of the alert will be given over the radio.

Be careful as there are 2 possibilities:

Grey alert – You can now go outside and the danger is over.

Orange alert - You can now go outside but the hurricane has turned around and is heading back. (As did Louis in 1965)

We will not be held responsible if you fail to go to a designated safe place

So what's it like? The hurricane EARL (2010) passed as a level 3 Hurricane with winds of up to 200 kph and 7 meter waves. Here the damage was to the foliage. The leaves and branches were everywhere but no structural damage occurred to the villa. We had to clean the villa walls with the Karcher immediately. If we had left it till later they would be stuck firm.

The pool was full of leaves but was soon cleared with the net.

The pool cleaners were at the villa very quickly to get it all cleared up properly.

We saw one idiot leave Gustavia harbour in his Catamaran and sail past us to Grand Colombier. He left at about 6pm just as the order not to put to sea had been implemented. He was fished from the sea and his Catamaran was in a 1000 pieces on the beach.

We were confined 20 hours in the lounge!

Gonzalo in 2014. It arrived on the eastern side of the island as a tropical storm but actually made landfall as a category 2 hurricane and caught everyone by surprise. It left as a category 3. We were ready by early afternoon and the winds got too strong by about 5pm. When the eye came over Eric came down to see us, had a lobster that Anne-Marie had prepared and went back as the eye passed and the wind picked up again. Again no major damage on the island and the clearing up was done brilliantly by all concerned.

Then came Irma! The strongest ever Atlantic hurricane at the time, with recorded gusts of 460 kilometres per hour (about 290 mph). Earthquake activity was recorded on the island but it was the force of the wind shaking everything, trees, villas etc. We were relatively lucky but still suffered lots of damage. The stories of people's lucky escapes convinced us that no one should remain in the villa during one. They are fickle things and change speed and direction without warning.

The villa still has a few scars from the 2017 hurricane and we apologise for that. Hopefully all will be rectified by your next visit !

BUGS AND OTHER ANIMALS

Being on a Caribbean Island you cannot avoid some of the strange insects and other animals that co-habit the Island with us.

You will see lots of tortoises both at the villa and on the roads all over the island. Many people stop to put them at the side of the road. Be careful if you do (hazard lights for other cars..)

There are the small « Yen-Yens » (pronounced Nyang-Nyangs) that fly low around your ankles in the early morning or early evening. They are little mosquitoes. Use the repellent « OFF » or similar. There may be some near the sink. Or have fun with the tennis bats. Do not swipe (they will break) just gently move them to the insect and zzzzap.

Very small ants can be seen making runs. Use the spray or the ant products in the kitchen, if you want to, or ask Martha - nicely! - to help

At night, light attracts moths of all sizes. Using the outdoor fan helps as well as turning off the terrace lights and using candles - (very romantic)

Some times, if a storm is in the air, you may have an invasion of small flying ants. We move the table out, turn out the lights and use (very romantic) candles for a while. You could turn on only the parking lights to tempt them away. They can be instantly killed with a fly spray BUT be warned they can come in their thousands, look disgusting, make a real mess if sprayed but are harmless. That's life. Don't try to kill them as you will only ruin the paintwork and there will be lots of them. You'll never win.

There also a type of builder wasp that seems to have its body in two parts! It will build several 2 inch long cocoons out of earth and lay eggs in them before sealing them up. The cocoons have holes in the top and when the babies are born they fly off. They make a mess but there is little we can do. Ask Martha or Eric to get rid of them if possible. They are very intelligent and watch me when I line up to thwack them, then nip through the opening when I am not looking. Now I close the doors when one comes in and wait until they settle then zzzzap or open the door a bit and let them fly out.

There are no dangerous snakes or beasts here in St Barts.

There are dozens of Tortoises, large, medium, small and tiny, around the villa. Take care on the drive down.

You can often see Turtles in the sea close to the shore. They appear as a small white patch and then they dive.

Please do not feed the wild cats as this encourages them to visit.

The mosquito nets are more to keep the cats out than anything else.

Lilos, Beach Chairs, Snorkels and Sunshades

Several clients have left some inflatable lilos, beach chairs, beach umbrellas, and an assortment of scuba stuff in the big red box, all of which are stored in the pump room beneath the terrace. Unless specifically wrapped, you may use them. However please rinse them well on returning to the villa as they rust very, very quickly here. Keep them behind the terrace armchairs. If you leave them in the pool alone they will be in the sea before you know it!

Ask Martha to let you see them as the pump room is normally kept locked. Borrow what you need.
